K4C Consortium moves ahead



UNESCO Chair has decided to move ahead with the creation of the K4C Consortium. It is our intention to take forward the Mentor Training Program (MTP) and in time see the emergence of 8-10 training hubs in various parts of the global South and the excluded North. We are identifying the components of the K4C plan that can be taken forward with existing resources we have available with us and our institutions.

We are also exploring new resources and funding opportunities in different parts of our worlds that can support K4C activities. An India-centric proposal, based largely on the ideas of our global K4C consortium, but tailored to the Indian context has been developed.

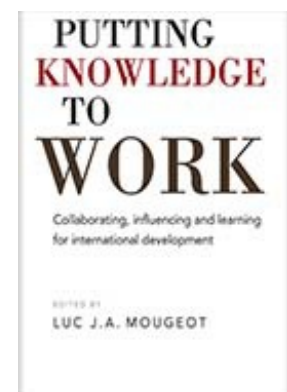
FOIST Laboratory celebrates its 40th anniversary

Putting knowledge to work: Collaborating, influencing & learning for international development

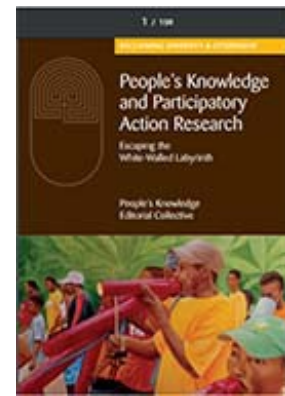
