Overview




Qalb (Heart)-Guided Leadership Model

The *Qalb* is the most important element to preserve high moral conduct, integrity, humility and respect of others, within leaders.


The Qalb-Guided Leadership model is grounded in both the Rukun Negara and National Education Philosophy, and espouses the concept of a "balanced and harmonious human being" who firmly believes in and is devoted to God, and of in service to society. It embraces the notion that the "right" traits and behaviours should emerge from consciousness of God, which is the most primal instinct for human beings. As the *Qalb* is central to a person's thoughts, actions, behaviours, feelings and emotions, such God-consciousness leads to the "Submissive Heart (Qalb al-Salim)." This in turn leads to the four principal virtues of Wisdom, Justice, Courage and Temperance. Nurtured in a perfectly balanced way, these virtues will manifest the desired leadership traits and behaviours of a Qalb-guided leader.



THE CONTEST OF VALUES AND PHYSICAL OF KAMPUNG IN MANIFESTING COMMUNITY LIFESTYLE – A CASE STUDY OF KAMPONG BHARU, KUALA LUMPUR

- ✓ This research discusses perceptions and manifestations of community lifestyle as described by a group of urban village (Kampung) land owners of Kampong Bharu, Kuala Lumpur, Kampong Bharu, Kuala Lumpur, has been claimed as a classic example of how rapid modernisation has transformed the cultural and physical elements of Kampung community.
- ✓ In this study, the elements of kampung values and needs of physical transformation have been investigated together to obtain a clearer understanding of how urban Kampung community deals with these two contested notions to manifest community lifestyle in harmony.
- ✓ Thirty Kampong Bharu land owners had been interviewed to gather the information about their opinion on the Kampong Bharu City Centre project.
- ✓ Using the video documentary method, this study also highlights the expectation of the land owners to preserve the value, tradition and harmony in the Kampung, and simultaneously embrace modernisation in the area. Nevertheless, these findings do not reveal any indication of how values of Kampung can be sustained and shared with the next generation of Kampung Baru.

Findings and discussions

3. Expectation of the land owners



Reorienting Education and Training Systems To Improve The Lives of Indigenous and Marginalized Youth

18th - 21st Jan 2017

Project Concept

In spite of numerous declarations and initiatives, Indigenous and marginalized youth remain amongst the least well served by their public education systems. There are many overlapping factors such as poverty, poorly paid teachers, inadequate facilities and in some instances, the lack of attendance due to illness or even child labour. This is debilitating not only for the individual youth but also for their communities. One problem is that little is known by those in charge of education systems of how to improve the education systems to address this issue. There is a dire need for innovative approaches to be developed, researched and the improved methodology quickly shared to address this injustice.

This global Project "Reorienting Education Systems to Improve the Lives of Indigenous and Marginalized Youth" intends to generate academic research into how schools and formal education systems could change to better meet local education needs of the Indigenous and marginalized youth in traditional communities and to develop recommendations to assist education leaders worldwide.

Objectives

There are three main objectives at the outset.

- 1) The first is to develop local approaches to improving the education of the school age youth.
- 2) The second is to improve the overall quality of community well-being as defined by the community itself.
- 3) The third objective is to disseminate the research findings to assist and guide other ministries of education and school systems in their attempts to meet their SDG responsibilities and targets.
