Knowledge for Change (K4C) officially launched in India and Canada



The UNESCO Chair's forthcoming initiative, Knowledge for Change (K4C) was officially launched in New Delhi, India on Nov 13, 2017 and in Ottawa, Canada on Dec 14, 2017. The two events witnessed a get-together of relevant stakeholders, partners and colleagues in the two countries. Along with marking the K4C launch, the events had interesting discussions on the relevance of CBR training and achieving the global SDGs by bringing together academic and non-academic actors to focus on local challenges.

While the Indian launch event was graced by Mr Shigeru Aoyagi, Director, UNESCO Delhi Office; the Canadian Launch witnessed dignitaries from the Canadian Commission of UNESCO and the Indian High Commission in Canada, among other colleagues.

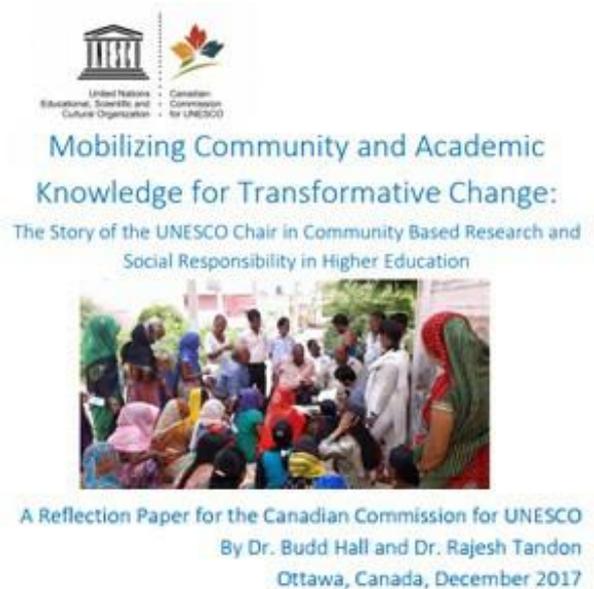
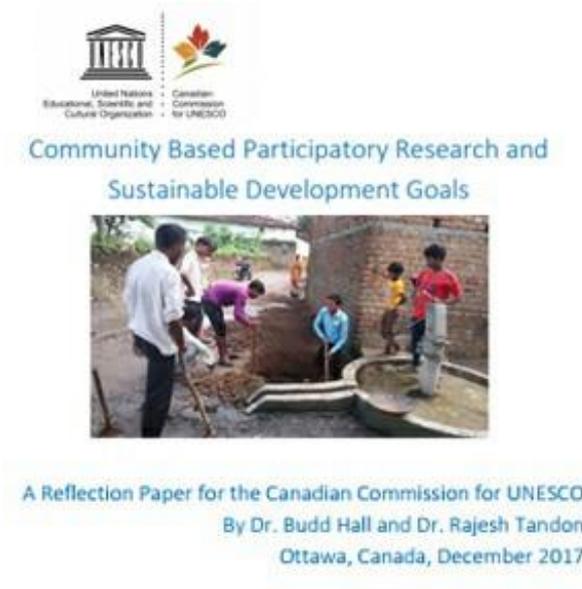

13th FICCI Higher Education Summit, November 9-11, 2017 New Delhi, India



The 13th FICCI Higher Education Summit was held from Nov 9-11, at the India Exposition Centre in Delhi NCR, India. The Chair registered its attendance at the Summit, which was important for us for two reasons. Firstly, the inaugural session of the summit on November 9, witnessed the launch of the knowledge paper titled; '*Social Outreach in Higher Education*'(available

our co-chair, Dr Rajesh Tandon.

Open Access Publication of La Mission Sociale des universities dan les Ameriques

The Institute for International Studies at the Universite de Quebec a Montreal has published the **open access edition** of the Conference Proceedings in four languages from the 2016 2nd Inter-american colloquium on the social mission of universities. Edited by Dorval Brunelle, this collection of papers provides useful background to issues of research, action and societal responsibility in the Americas. In addition to several excellent overviews of the contexts in Latin America and globally, one can find papers with a focus on the USA, Quebec, Haiti, Costa Rica, India and Canada. Dr Budd Hall and Dr Rajesh Tandon have a chapter in the book on "*Knowledge, Democracy and Action: A Challenge to Higher Education*" (p. 429).

Leibniz Centre for Agricultural Landscape Research (ZALF) and Sokoine University of Tanzania promote community-based research to address future challenges

This initiative aimed to understand the aspect of food insecurity and create local solutions under the SCALE-N project. Educational tools were developed to engage community voices in realising SDG number 2 on hunger. The researchers Michelle Bonatti and Nyamizi Bundala conducted 16 workshops, involving a total of 270 participants across the four case studies in remote Tanzanian villages. This experience showed that community voices and local problem perceptions significantly differed between the case study regions, which had a strong impact on coping strategies and nutritional status. Ethical issues in using visual methods in participatory research

In Nov 2017, the Centre for Social Justice and Community Action and the Centre for Visual Arts and Culture, Durham University, UK held a workshop on *Visual Methods on Participatory Research: ethical and practical issues on working with refugees and other groups*. It was attended by community organisations, national charities, local government, museums and postgraduates and academics from universities. A choice of workshops covering different visual methods included performing family stories, digital storytelling with refugee women, the walking interview biographical method (WIBM), participatory video with young migrants and refugees and participatory drawing. Global Engagement Meetings (GEM), New Delhi

The Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF) (a UK government initiative that has diverted £1.5 billion from the aid budget into interdisciplinary development research over a five year period), conducted the second of four GEMs in New Delhi from Nov 7-9, 2017. These were planned as networking and research generation events in different parts of the world, and over a hundred delegates from across 17 different countries participated. Andrew Russell from Durham University, UK and Sumona Dasgupta from PRIA, India attended the meetings and were struck by how frequently the participatory paradigm was followed in many of the talks given by development experts at the meeting, but how much of a new concept it appeared to be for many of the academics attending. Perhaps there is a scope for the Knowledge4Change (K4C) partnership to do work with academics, new to the principles of participatory research?
